Daniel Klinkenberg, President of the New York State Society, Children of the American Revolution, presented his project "Helping Military Families," during the September 15 meeting of the Saratoga Battle Chapter, Sons of the American Revolution.

The National Society of the Children of the American Revolution, founded in 1895, is the oldest patriotic organization for youths in our country. Membership is open to descendants of patriots of the American Revolution.

Klinkenberg is raising money to support a renovation mission at the Fisher House at the Stratton VA Medical Center in Albany.

The Samuel S. Stratton Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center was the first VA Medical Center in the Nation selected as a site for the Zachary and Elizabeth Fisher House.

Fisher House is a home-away-from-home for families of hospitalized veterans or veterans in the area to visit a hospitalized member of their immediate family.

Following his presentation, the assembly of the SAR's Saratoga Battle Chapter voted unanimously to donate \$500 to the effort.

Lampman joined the SAR through the Saratoga Battle Chapter as a Scotia resident in 1993, according biography shared by Lampman-Boulden.

The 26-year Navy Veteran served Marines in Vietnam as a Naval Gunfire Division—directing Liaison Officer involved in 20 naval gunfire from the front lines.


