ANCESTOR CORNER

Josiah Bugbee is my most recently-discovered Patriot Ancestor. Several years ago, while working on my mother's Bailey family of Sand Lake, Rensselaer County, NY, I was able to extend them back one generation. In the process I picked up the Bugbee surname, which was new to me. A check of my Rev. War Pension Abstracts revealed a Josiah Bugbee who had gotten a pension and who had died in Sand Lake.

Working with a local Bailey/Bugbee cousin, I found the genealogy papers of A.H. Sage in the NYS Archives in Albany. Sage spent over 30 years on various of his family lines; because his mother was a Bailey descendant, he spent a lot of time on Bailey research. In his "Bailey Family History," published in 1902 in a small upstate New York newspaper, he mentioned the wives of my ancestor Warren Bailey and his brother Joseph as being Jane and Miranda, daughters of Josiah Bugbee of Sand Lake. Additional research in Josiah's pension file, along with bible information, confirmed him as my ancestor.

Josiah served 3+ years with the NY 5th Rgmt. His military file shows that his service took him to, among other places: New Windsor, Peekskill, White Plains, Fishkill, Schoharie, Johnstown, Canajoharie and Morristown. He enlisted Jan. 1, 1777 for 3 years and was discharged Apr. 1, 1780. At enlistment, Josiah lived in what is now the town of Greenbush, Rensselaer county.

Josiah was the son of Israel and Bethsheba Buckbee of Dutchess Co., NY. He always spelled his surname "Bugbee" while his half brother Richard went by "Buckbee."

His simple obituary in the Troy Northern Budget of Jun. 25, 1839 reads:

"Another Revolutionary Hero gone. Died at his residence at Sand Lake on the 20th inst., after a short illness, Josiah Bugbee, in the 87th year of his age. A respectable citizen, and a distinguished hero of '76, who had the honor of comabting in several battles with the enemies of his country."

REVOLUTIONARY WAR RESEARCH ON CD-ROM

The current issue of the SAR Magazine contains an ad for two long-awaited resources for Rev. War genealogical research, both on CD-ROM. The first is the new issue of the SAR Graves Register, last published in book form in 1993. The new Register contains information on over 69,000 patriot burials, up from some 25, 000 in 1993. Searches can be done by name as well as by cemetery and other means.

The second CD-ROM is the SAR PATRIOT INDEX. Similar to the more familiar DAR PATRIOT INDEX, this resource contains over 450,000 records of patriots and their descendants. It comes with its own Progeny Family Explorer for conducting numerous kinds of searches and printing all types of reports. The patriot index will be available in early Summer.
