Meet Your Chapter Chaplain Charles Wheeler

A native of Albany NY, he graduated with a business degree from Utica College and then served in the US Army in Vietnam as a 1St Lieutenant. Following his discharge I entered the hotel convention center industry where he worked for 40 plus years. My last position prior to retirement was as Facility Manager for the Saratoga

Racecourse.

My interest in American military history started as a youngster influenced by learning I was a descendant of Col. Josiah Whitney of the 2nd MA Militia (1779) and family

descendant of Col. Josiah Whitney of I purchased my first antique weapon the 2nd MA Militia (1779) and family at an age 11. Over the years I studied members serving as Adjutant General the weapons utilized by Americans

from the French and Indian War thought the Second World War. In 2002 I was invited to join the prestigious American Society of Arms Collectors. This organization has members from throughout the US, Canada and in Brittan. The group is dedicated to research, preservation, and dissemination of

information on Arms and Armor. One of my prized bit of memorabilia is First Model Brown Bess that was carried by a soldier in the Royal Fusiliers (21st of Foot) on the Saratoga Battlefield where it was surrendered in October 1777.

Cemetery Seeks Grant To Honor Dozens Of Patriots

overing Over 280 acres,
Oakwood Cemetery in
Troy is renowned for
architecture, natural
beauty and the Gardner Earl
Memorial Chapel and Crematorium,
a National Historic Landmark and
rare plants.

Now, caretakers are hoping to add another feature to recognize: Oakwood Cemetery is the final resting place of dozens of Patriots of the American Revolution.

Caretakers have identified 39
Patriots whose contribution to the
American Revolution has gone
largely unrecognized.

The Saratoga Battle Chapter is assisting cemetery representatives with an application to the Pomeroy Foundation's Patriot Burials Marker

Grant Program.

The effort recognizes those who were involved in the fight for American Independence by funding the cost of an historic marker to identify the Patriots buried there.

The application process is currently underway, and a final application is due in late April.
