he Saratoga Battle Chapter agreed to honor more than a dozen people for their work promoting the 250th Anniversary of the American Revolution.

An agreement to purchase medals and certificates was reached during the Annual Meeting & Washington's Birthday Luncheon held at The Factory in Ballston Spa on February 19.

About 30 people attended the meeting and three more were able to follow the meeting on Zoom.

Compatriots and members of the community are eligible for recognition under the 250th Anniversary of the American Revolution Recognition Program.


ecently, the Saratoga Battle Chapter

partnered with the Saratoga DAR, Empire State DAR, and Adirondack Trust Bank, in purchasing an historic sign describing the Battle of Saratoga.

The sign was one of eight produced for the DAR to be placed at the Saratoga Battlefield when it was

first opened in 1908. These were the first historical markers placed at the Battlefield! Of the eight signs only one is known to still exist, which was recently discovered in a barn in Schuylerville. The sign was purchased by an antique dealer who offered it for sale for \$4500. Once

Program materials outline the effort to recognize compatriots, chapters and societies that "take participate in local, state, national and international events which publicly educate, and recognize, honor and celebrate the events and heroes of the period surrounding the American Revolution."

Congratulations to our friend, 2nd Continental Artillery Regiment member David Wren for earning the SAR Good Citizenship Medal and Certificate during the meeting.

The Saratoga Battle Chapter's Color Guard works cooperatively with the recreated 2nd Continental Artillery Regiment to display formations and canon and musket salutes throughout the region.

But not all of these reenactors are SAR members. Chapters are able to recognize these

individuals with the Bronze Good Citizenship Medal. Earning the Bronze 250th Medal was Robert M. Wesser.

The chapter's membership, following a plea from Past President Duane Booth, voted to budget \$250 annually through 2027 for supplies including gunpowder for the Color Guard.

Chapter Registrar Thomas Dunne reported the chapter's membership count at 224 including 11 new members.

Jeremy Shank was approved for supplemental applications for ancestors PS Cornelius Pease -NJ and Capt. & PS Joseph Chandler - NH.

During his report, Chapter Treasurer David Flint outlined the chapter's donations totaling by contributions from Saratoga \$700, as follows:

Also during the meeting, Membership agreed to put up \$500 in funding towards the purchase of an historic sign the first believed to have been displayed on the Battles of Saratoga, Freeman's Farm site.

That contribution was followed and New York State DAR and Adirondack Trust Bank.

veterans. A Quonset Hut is planned for a cafe for veterans, their family members and the public to use, with light breakfast and lunches.

A military museum is planned, where loved ones can display war memorabilia.

Walking paths are also planned for the rear of the Quonset hut featuring seven major conflicts, WWI, WW2, Korea, Vietnam, Gulf War, Iraq and Afghanistan.

Additional areas will honor other conflicts including Bosnia and Kosovo.

Each will have a Battlefield Cross, Monument and history elements for education.

An amphitheater will be developed on the point of Dutch Meadows Lane for bands. Benches, Battlefield Crosses, History Pedestals and Monuments are among items available to be purchased and dedicated.


### New Book By Local Author Expected in December
