ANCESTOR CORNER by

John Jacobs was born 13 March 1757 in Wells (York County) in the District of Maine (then part of Massachusetts). He was the 2nd great grandson of George Jacobs, who was one of the 19 men and women hanged for witchcraft in Salem in 1692.

John enlisted in 1776 at the age of nineteen in the 1st Massachusetts Regiment of the Continental Line. This regiment was at both Battles of Saratoga in 1777, but we are not clear on exactly what action the unit saw. John's brother George was with him in the 1st Regiment at this time. John's records state that he was at Saratoga, Valley Forge and was "in Canada" with the Massachusetts troops in 1776. His records indicate that he was wounded in the leg, but no details are provided.

John returned home in 1780, when he gained a "substitute" (Daniel Jacobs) to take his place in the 1st Regiment. In 1782, John married Tabitha Bennet, and they had two known children, one of whom, Woodman Bennett Jacobs, is my third great grandfather. Tabitha died in 1794, and two years later John married Sarah Eaton. In a document from 1820 in his Revolutionary War Pension File, John states that he and Sarah had the following children: Abigail, Betsey, Tabitha and Jesse E. Sometime, probably in the 1830's, Sarah died and John then married Phoebe Bigger in Mount Vernon, Maine.

John owned a 50-acre farm in Mount Vernon, which included a small house and barn, all worth \$150; John described himself as "destitute." He owned a few farm animals and minimal household furnishings. He owed \$114 in outstanding loans, his wife Sarah was ill, and he had 3 daughters and a son at home, with one of the daughters being disabled. It is possible that John's old leg injury impeded his ability to make a living at farming.

John's son Jesse had been working the farm for John at no pay for several years prior to John's pension application. Jesse married Jane Richer in 1821 and bought the farm from his father, paying off John's debts and allowing him and the rest of the family to continue living on the farm.

John's pension application was approved and the \$8 per month private's pension would have been sorely needed. John died at Mount Vernon, Maine on 22 November 1843 at age 86.
