# CHAPTER HELPS WALLOOMSAC BATTLE WITH GRAVE-MARKING SERVICE

On Sunday November 1<sup>st</sup> several members helped neighboring Walloomsac Battle Chapter with a member grave marking at the East Hebron Cemetery for memorial member Archibald Robert Craig who had wanted to join the SAR but never did so before he died.

Arch passed away on May 1, 2008 without joining but his daughters Deborah and Dorothea remembered his wish. Arch's family decided to pursue the Memorial Membership, which required Arch's brother, Harold to join. As Dorothea was already in the DAR the process was simplified and they both were admitted to the SAR on September 23<sup>rd</sup>.

In a conversation with Debi, Duane Booth learned just how proud Arch was of his patriot ancestor, Jacob Bailey (or Bayley), who served as a brigadier general in the Vermont Militia. Duane suggested a member grave marking service and the family agreed it would be fitting, for Arch had spent many hours researching his patriot and fondly referred to him as old Jake Bayley.

Genealogist & Battle Lines editor Dennis Marr\* who is also Executive Director of the Rhodes Memorial Fund secured a small grant to cover the cost of the marker and other expenses. Treasurer Mike Companion\* agreed to bring "Cricket" (his cannon) and members of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Continental Artillery to serve on the cannon crew. John Sheaff\* served as as master of ceremonies, Duane\* lead the Pledge of Allegiance and R. Harry Booth, who served with Arch on the Board of Supervisors, lead the Pledge to the SAR. Charlie Walter\* and Peter Swano (Walloomsac Battle) were also there. (\* = Dual Chapter member).

Bagpipe music was played by David Jones; Rev. David Simmons gave the invocation; flag bearers were Michael Casey, grandson & Gage Boddery; daughter Debi spoke of her Dad & Dort of patriot Jacob Bailey; Rev. Lois Ann Wolf gave the benediction and the ceremony was closed with Delaney Dupuis and Kristen Pierce playing "Taps". Family invited guests and participants to Debi's for food & a celebratory cake, made by Dort, that was beautifully decorated with the SAR Insignia and tasting as good as it looked.

This may be the first Memorial Membership for our Society.
