#### <u>GENEALOGY CORNER</u> Dennis F. Marr

In April of 2016 a remarkable set of records went online, records that I never thought I'd live to see. This was the Irish Catholic Parish Registers 1655-1915 and they were posted on Ancestry.com among other places. Access to these records was very spotty in the past with Catholic bishops first allowing a county's parish records to be accessed locally, only to rescind this access later.

I have about 18 Irish immigrant lines and knew nothing of them except for my Dwyer ancestor who married my Marr ancestor in Troy, NY. This record was provided to me by a cousin who made 3 trips to County Tipperary before locating the proper parish.

With access to the full record set I was able to locate a number of immigrant ancestors' origins, parentage and even earlier generations. One huge surprise was the original surname of my Marr immigrant Patrick. On the few references I have found to him, he is uniformly called Marr. Upon locating his baptismal record from 1814 I learned that our surname in Ireland was MARA and that they were from the village of Killea, Parish of Templemore in County Tipperrary. We had always assumed that the name was originally Meagher/Maher, etc. (all pronounced Marr).

#### SOME HELPFUL FACEBOOK PAGES

I have joined a number of Facebook pages that have a focus on genealogy and the Revolutionary War. There are many queries posted on these pages and often helpful information is provided by readers.
