<u>BOOK REVIEW</u> By Compatriot Douglas M. Gallant

At our annual Chapter meeting this past February, there was a sheet of paper on the tables about the book The Colonial Wars 1689 - 1762, by Howard Peckham. Whoever did that - thank you! I found it to be very informative. It covers the 4 wars that occurred during the pre-Revolution period and their impact in North America. Given that the book is only 220 pages, it doesn't delve into details but instead gives a broad though thorough account. As the author notes, this is a period of history that is generally ignored in contemporary history books with the exception of the French and Indian War. But all of these wars were really a sequence of connected events that culminated with the **Revolution.** Aside from covering the actual European powers and their related colonies and settlements, the author also includes details on how the various Indian nations/tribes were courted by all sides in the various conflicts and how their choice of sides generally led to their demise or displacement. Overall, I would give this book two big thumbs-up, five stars, etc. and recommend it to everyone.
