CITIZENSHIP CEREMONY A SUCCESS

The July 4th Citizenship Ceremony at the Saratoga Battlefield was very well received and appreciated by the candidates and their families. About 200 people turned out to welcome the 20 new citizens who took the Oath of Allegiance to the United States. The Chapter, in joint sponsorship with the Saratoga Chapter NSDAR, the Friends of Saratoga Battlefield, the US Citizenship and Immigration Service and the Saratoga National Historical Park held what Park officials believe was the first ceremony of this kind held on the historic and hallowed grounds.

Chapter President Duane Booth noted in the Program's welcome that it was fitting, on America's Birthday, to gather and welcome new citizens as they made a turning point in their lives on the very spot where the Turning Point of the American Revolution occurred.

The event was very well covered by the press and television stations. In the debriefing that was held a few weeks after the event, it was decided to hold a second ceremony next July 4th. RHODES MEMORIAL FUND CONTINUES AS SPONSOR OF KNIGHT ESSAY CONTEST

For the fifth consecutive year, the Rhodes Memorial Fund has provided a \$5,000 grant to the NSSAR towards the Knight Essay Contest prize fund; NSSAR has designated the Fund as a co-sponsor of this important youth program. The grant was secured with the assistance of Registrar/Genealogist Dennis Marr, who serves as Executive Director of the Fund. Saratoga Battle has been an enthusiastic supporter of this annual youth contest, for which special thanks are due to Pres. Duane Booth and Past Pres. Rick Saunders.

NEWS FROM THE NYS MILITARY MUSEUM

Our thanks to Past President Bill Glidden of Plattsburgh for keeping us informed on the activities of the NYS Military Heritage Institute which operates the NYS Military Museum and Veterans' Research Center in Saratoga Springs. Bill, a retired Major in the NYARNG, serves as a Trustee of the Museum.

The Museum recently underwent a four-month \$300,000 renovation project. Included in the project were new exhibits and exhibit space, a new air conditioning system, a newly refinished floor, new lighting and a new museum store.

Highlighting the reopening festivities was the donation of a New York State flag flown over "Camp New York" in Iraq by the U.S. Army's 101st Airborne Division during the initial phase of Operation Iraqi Freedom. The flag was sent to the unit in Iraq at the behest of Gov. George Pataki, in response to a request from the battlefield by Westchester County native and West Point graduate Col. Joe Anderson. Col. Anderson was at the time serving as commander of the 2nd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division.

Sgt. First Class John Rosario, along with two others from the unit, all New Yorkers, explained how the flag was flown over their camp as they moved throughout the country during their tour. They completed the flag's tour of duty by returning it to the people of New York for display and safekeeping in the State Military Museum.

Saratoga Battle Chapter is proud to be a Charter Member of the Museum, joining many years ago when it was first established in Albany.
