SWORD SURRENDER COMMEMORATIVE COIN PLANNED

The United States Mint has announced that, as part of the 2015 America the Beautiful quarter program, a coin will be issued commemorating the sword surrender. The mint describes the design as: "This design is a close-up of the moment General John Burgoyne surrendered his sword to General Horatio Gates, a pivotal moment many believe marked the 'beginning of the end of the American Revolutionary War.' Inscriptions are BRITISH SURRENDER 1777, SARATOGA, NEW YORK, 2015, and E PLURIBUS UNUM." Below is one rendering of the proposed design and is not necessarily the final one.
