N.Y.S.S.C.A.R. STATE CONFERENCE

Several chapter members attended portions of the N.Y.S.S.C.A.R. conference held in Albany the weekend of March 4-6. This was an outstanding affair, and a fitting tribute to Lexi Zerillo's term as NYS President.

Among Lexi's numerous accomplishments was the successful completion of her State Project: Cherish Our Freedom – Honor Our Veterans. Lexi raised over \$9,500 for her primary goals: the placement of a C.A.R. memorial marker on the Memorial Walk at the Saratoga National Veterans' Cemetery (\$3,225); the remainder of the funds was donated to the NYS Military Heritage Museum in Saratoga Springs for their Flag Preservation Project. The monument was dedicated on the afternoon of March 5.

At the Saturday evening banquet, the Schuyler Society was named the Most Outstanding Society in the state. Schuyler also took the Membership Bowl for the society with the highest net gain in membership (14 new members, a 35% increase).

Bemis Heights Society was named Third Most Outstanding Society in the state. They also were awarded 26 First Place contest awards and 5 Second Place ones; they received a check for \$126 for their contest awards.

While Lexi has completed her term as State President, her mother Sandy continues as Senior State President (a 3-year term). Congratulations to both ladies for outstanding service to their societies.

Also in attendance was ESSSAR President Bill Woodworth, and we were happy to see Ron and Helen Newton from Maine.

The deportment and attire of the children was most impressive, a tribute not only to their fine upbringings, but also to the ideals instilled in them by their senior officers and the C.A.R. Saratoga Battle can take pride in being a sponsor of both the Schuyler and Bemis Heights societies.

MEMBER HAS BOOK PUBLISHED

Chapter member Edward Lee Cox has had his book on Major General Fox Connor published. Entitled "Grey Eminence – Fox Connor and the Art of Mentorship," the book is available for \$16.95 at Amazon.com as well as from the author via his website: www.edwardleecox.com.

Connor was a mentor to Generals Eisenhower, Marshall and Patton during the period between the World Wars, but little was known about Connor himself. After a career spanning four decades, he ordered all of his papers and journals burned. This book combines existing scholarship with long-forgotten references and unpublished original sources to achieve a more comprehensive picture of this dedicated public servant.

This book will be of interest to all military historians and those with a more general interest in military history.
