INTERESTING REVOLUTIONARY WAR BOOK

Marr, has a knack for finding interesting books for me as gifts at Christmas, birthday, etc. This past Christmas he gave me a wonderful new book: *Reporting the Revolutionary War: Before It Was History, It Was News*, by Todd Andrlik; 2012; Sourcebooks, Inc., PO Box 4410, Naperville, IL 60560-4410.

Actual newspaper articles are reproduced covering all of the major aspects of the war. These articles stretch from May of 1764 to November of 1787. Throughout, the author places the articles into historical context with explanatory material. A blurb on the jacket calls the book "a stunning collection of primary sources detailing what it was like to experience a revolution as it happened."
